The World BOSAI Forum (WBF) is a cosmopolitan forum from Sendai, Japan, which brings together representatives of international organizations, governments, academia, and the private sector for disaster risk reduction (DRR).

Cooperation with IDRC Davos



WBF is in cooperation with the International Disaster Risk Conference in Davos, Switzerland (IDRC Davos). The WBF focuses on the Asia-Pacific region and opens to a wide range of citizens. WBF and IDRC Davos alternate every other year to promote DRR while taking advantage of each other's features.

Other Activities

World BOSAI Walk Tohoku +10

Commemorating the 10th anniversary of the Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami, we conducted a 500 miles journey which is to capture "Build Back Better" efforts in the tsunami-affected area of Tohoku and broadcast it to the world.

Supporting the Development of the World Bosai Museum Network

WBF supports the development of a network of museums related to disasters where citizens can feel familiar with DRR by creating a system that allows museums to communicate with each other and share exhibits virtually.

Supporting the Activities of Global Centre for Disaster Statistics

WBF is supporting Tohoku University's efforts to use cloud technology to store data and add analysis to them to encourage countries to use them as policies.

DRR Project in Developing Countries

As a BOSAI practice, WBF cooperates with the Bangladesh government, the World Wind Engineering Association, and other organizations, to support the introduction of an ICT-based tornado warning system and shelters that can save the lives of local people.
