On March 11th 2011, the Great East Japan Earthquake caused a tsunami to surge up to the second floor of the school building, causing extensive damage to Sendai Municipal Arahama Elementary School.

On the day of the disaster, 320 people, including students, teachers and local residents, evacuated to the school building, which has since been opened to the public as a disaster memorial, passing on the lessons of the Great East Japan Earthquake and the memories of the local community to future generations.
